## CALLS FOR SERVICE

Calls for service are calls that are made to the police department, either using the emergency or non-emergency numbers. They can be used to measure the activity of the officers at specific times and places, but are not necessarily a good measurement of the crime rate. Often calls for service are settled at the scene or unfounded, and do not require a report to be taken. Some examples are loud parties, or juvenile nuisances. They can often be settled quickly by the officer without any necessary arrest or follow up. In other cases, the call for service may not end up being what it was originally reported. For example, a resident may call and complain about a suspicious person lurking at the house across the street. This is logged as a suspicious person call, but when the officer arrives, it ends up being the

neighbor locked out of his home, or a burglar trying to get in, or an intoxicated vagrant that is lost. In each of these cases, the end result is not actually a suspicious person, but something else. Finally, it must be noted that these calls are the initial, raw numbers, before detectives have investigated the incident (when a report is written). Often reports are written, and then closed as "Unfounded", or reclassified to a different type of incident. Calls for service indicate where the officer was sent, not necessarily where the incident occurred.
